## The latest from KiS - February, 2025



#### **Grade 6: Mendelian Rules**

Grade 6 learners explored Mendelian genetics through a fun and interactive class activity using Punnett squares. They learned how traits are inherited from parents to offspring by predicting genetic combinations, which helped them understand dominant and recessive traits in an engaging way!

#### Grade 8: Electric Charges Field

Grade 8 learners engaged in an inquiry-based lab activity using the PhET simulation to explore how moving electric charges generate magnetic fields. Through hands-on investigation, they visualized electromagnetism in action, deepening their understanding of this fundamental concept.

#### Grade 7: Chemical Reactions Lab

Grade 7 learners tested several chemical reactions in the lab, amazed by the colour changes, fizzing, and bubbling as science came to life before their eyes. It was a fun hands-on experience!

#### Grade 7: DNA Hands-on Activity

Grade 7 learners engaged in an inquiry-based activity to explore DNA replication and transcription. Using a simulation, they visualized how DNA copies itself and how genetic instructions are used to build protein chains. Additionally, they conducted a hands-on activity where they built their own DNA double helix model, reinforcing their understanding of the structure and function of DNA in living organisms.

### World of Robotics

Learners are thrilled to visit the robotics lab each week.


