Science Highlights - Hands-On Learning Across Grades

Grade 4

 Learners dissected and labeled the parts of a flower, enjoying a hands-on exploration of plant anatomy.



Grade 5

- Learners conducted hands-on experiments to explore chemical and physical changes, fostering curiosity and understanding through real-world science.
- They also explored the difference between mixtures and solutions, cutting, sorting, and classifying items on charts—enhancing observation, critical thinking, and fine motor skills while engaging in collaborative discussions.









Grade 7

- Our young scientists explored density by measuring the mass and volume of everyday liquids. They calculated density, predicted the order, and poured carefully into a graduated cylinder building their own colorful density tower!
- Learners applied the engineering design process—ideate, prototype, test, iterate—
 to build safety helmets, iterating designs based on impact and deformation data,
 promoting practical problem-solving and critical thinking.







Grade 8

• Learners investigated the circulatory system through an inquiry-based heart dissection, bringing science to life.

Grade 8 learners explored in chemistry class how ionic and covalent bonds form molecules. Using atomic model kits, they built sample compounds and visualized molecular structures.

To connect classroom learning with the real world, learners researched everyday uses of these molecules—linking their particle models to products. This activity highlighted

the practical relevance of molecular science in daily life.
